If you've been to San Antonio, you know what we're talking about. This is an interesting, historical and scenic part of our country that is an intriguing place to visit. We have designed a tour that includes great entertainment, delicious food, interesting museums, fun shopping, lodging on the river walk and much more. Add a day in the capital city of Austin and you have a great central Texas tour. And we'll do it in the spring when the city is in bloom. So read on. You know you'll be tired of winter by then...so put this one on the calendar and we promise to show you a great time.

Daily Itinerary:

**March 22:** This morning we board our flight to Austin, Texas, arriving around 2:00. After checking into our hotel, we'll take you to the famous "Warehouse District" for some fun browsing downtown. Just before sunset, we'll do something unique. We'll take a **sunset cruise on Town Lake** (which is right downtown). At sunset, thousands of bats emerge and we'll be in prime viewing position. I know it sounds creepy, but Austin is home to 1.5 million bats and it is very interesting to learn about these mammals. It's also a fun way to learn about the city. Trust me. This is fun. We'll then enjoy dinner together. (D)

**March 23:** This morning we'll enjoy a locally guided "**Texpert Tour**" showing us the highlights of Austin including the lovely downtown area (one of the nicest in the US), University of Texas, Mount Bonnell and the scenic "Hill Country". After lunch on your own, it's only about a 90 minute drive into **San Antonio**, where we'll arrive mid afternoon. We are staying at the **Tropicano Hotel on the River Walk**... an excellent location. After checking in and relaxing, we'll enjoy a 40 minute narrated **boat ride on the San Antonio River**, becoming familiar with the River Walk which is shaded by towering cypress, oak, and willow trees, and is bordered by gardens of flowering ornamental plants. We'll enjoy dinner tonight on the most famous restaurant on the river: **Casa Rio**. This sits on land first granted by the king of Spain in 1777. You'll love the cedar doors, window lintels, fireplace and thick rock walls. After dinner you'll have time on your own to wander the lovely paths along the river. (B, D)

**March 24:** After breakfast at the hotel, we'll meet our local guide for an overview tour which includes the Spanish **Governor's Palace** (labeled the most beautiful in San Antonio) with it's incredible antique furnishings, **San Fernando Cathedral** (the oldest in the United States) and the **Mission San Jose**. We'll end the tour at "**El Mercado**" which is alive all day with Mariachis, Tejano bands, folkloric dances and food booths. There are restaurants and 32 shops and it's a fun place to get lunch on your own and enjoy the atmosphere. In the afternoon, we'll visit **San Pedro Springs Park** located on land reserved for public use by the Spanish government in the 1700's. Only the Boston Common predates this lovely public park. After a rest at the hotel, we'll enjoy dinner together at **The Little Red Barn** (serving more than 1,000 steaks a day!). At 7:30 this evening (weather permitting), we'll ascend to the top of the **Tower of the Americas** for panoramic views of the area – which is particularly beautiful at night. (B, D)

**March 25:** After breakfast, we'll visit another charming area called "**La Villita**". This Spanish "little town" is the original settlement of Old San Antonio and is one square block in the heart of the city. Today it's an attractive arts and crafts community amidst beautifully landscaped grounds and historic buildings. At 11:00, we'll see an extraordinary **IMAX film entitled Alamo... The Price of Freedom** where we'll learn of the interesting struggle for Texas independence. Lunch is at **the Buckhorn Saloon** which houses cowboy memorabilia, a two headed calf, a lamb with 8 legs & more. It is a fun place to eat and look around. After a rest, we'll drive out to **the Alamo** where we'll have a guided walking tour of the grounds. From there, it's a short drive over to **El Rio Cibolo Ranch**. This is one of the highlights of the trip. We'll enjoy a real western dinner (delicious!), followed by Cowboy Olympics, Hay Wagon rides and Marshmallow Roasting while listening to a 6<sup>th</sup> generation Texan storyteller. It is a very memorable evening. (B,D)

**March 26:** Another great day in the area as we travel out to the **LBJ National Historical Park Visitors Center** (just over an hour away). We'll see the film: **Ladybird Johnson and LBJ the President**. We'll tour LBJ's boyhood home and we'll enjoy the beauty of this area. We'll then drive through the Hill Country backroads to the charming German community of **Fredricksburg**, settled by brave German pioneers in the mid-1800's. Lunch and shopping on your own along Main Street in this quaint little town. While here, you can visit the Admiral Nimitz Museum (of World War II fame). We'll then return to San Antonio for a rest at the hotel. Dinner tonight is at a place called "**The Original Mexican Restaurant**" operated by the Farnsworth family since 1899 (oldest in the US). Great entertainment while enjoying a delicious meal. (B, D)

**March 27:** After breakfast and check out, you can choose between two museums. One is the Museum of Art and the other is the Institute of Texan Cultures. We'll explain the details of each. Lunch is on your own followed by our return trip to the airport for our flight home. (B)

**Registration Information:**

To make a reservation, simply **fill out the attached reservation form and send it to us with a deposit of \$300 per person.** When we receive your deposit, we will mail you a receipt confirming that you are registered for the tour. A letter with instructions, hotel itinerary flight information (if applicable) and luggage tags will be sent 45-60 days prior to departure at which time the balance will be due. You do not need to pay the balance until after you receive that packet. We require final payments in the form of a check. If that is not possible, arrangements can be made to use a credit card. Webb Tours accepts Visa, Mastercard and Discover.

**Cancellation Penalties**

We understand that you may need to cancel your trip for whatever reason. If it is 60 days or more before departure, all money will be refunded. If it is within 60 days, we will charge you only what Webb Tours cannot recover. In some cases, we can recover all of it. In others, we cannot. Cruise lines, airlines, hotels and other service providers require funds in advance and have their own rules about what will be refunded once paid. We must follow their guidelines. For airlines, specifically, tickets are generally non refundable when purchased. However, most airlines will allow the value of the canceled tickets to be reused for future travel, though a penalty may be assessed to reuse the tickets. If you have to cancel, Webb Tours will work with other providers to obtain as much refund as possible for our travelers. Our travelers know us to be very fair in this regard.

**Cancellation Insurance:**

Cancellation insurance is also available should you be interested. The insurance provider that we use is a company called Travelex. You can learn about them at [www.travelexinsurance.com](http://www.travelexinsurance.com). With this insurance, most of your money will be returned to you in case you have to cancel for covered reasons (illness or death of an immediate family member) at the last minute. The price for the insurance varies based on the price of the trip and the age of the participant (at the time the insurance is purchased). Prices are as follows:

However, insurance may be purchased any time up to the point you make your final payment. Insurance cannot be purchased after your final payment is made. Webb Tours is not the insurer and acts as agent for Travelex. To activate your insurance, we need your premium and your birth date. **Insurance also includes trip interruption coverage (if you have to leave the tour early), \$500,000 medical evacuation, \$50,000 in medical benefits, \$1,000 for lost baggage and \$250 for baggage delay.**
