**June 30, 2010:** Today we board our overnight flight into Munich, Germany arriving the morning of July 1st.

**July 1:** We'll arrive in Munich in the late morning and you'll be transferred to the hotel where you'll have a chance to rest. There is an opportunity to visit Dachau, outside of Munich. This was the first concentration camp, opened immediately after Hitler's rise to power. The camp site is maintained as a memorial and excellent background information is provided on the journey. This evening we enjoy dinner together as a group as we meet our local tour director and other travelers. D

**July 2:** *Munich.* There is much to see in Munich, known as Germany's "Secret Capital". A local guide will spend the morning with us and show us the highlights of the city including a visit to famous Marienplatz, showcasing the old city and the new city side by side. We'll also see the gothic Frauenkirche. There is some free time in the afternoon to do your own thing or choose an optional excursion. B

**July 3:** *Munich – Fussen – Innsbruck - Salzburg.* This morning we drive along the Romantic Road to Mad Ludwig's famous castle: Neuschwanstein. This is the MOST famous of all European castles (see front of brochure) because of its majestic setting, interesting history and striking architecture. We'll enjoy a tour inside. The scenes inside and out are beyond words. We will then cross over the Tyrolean Alps into the alpine town of Innsbruck. We'll have a chance to browse in the medieval town center, including a look at Emperor Maximilian's Golden Roof. In the late afternoon, we'll enjoy a scenic drive into one of Europe's most beautiful towns: Salzburg where we'll spend two nights. Dinner is included tonight. B, D

**July 4:** *Salzburg.* A knowledgeable local guide will take us on an interesting walking tour of the old city. We'll start in beautiful Mirabell Gardens (made famous in the Sound of Music) followed by a stroll to Great Festival Hall, St. Peter's Churchyard and the monument in Domplatz. We'll also visit the interior of Mozart's birthplace on charming Getreidegasse. This afternoon, we'll enjoy a scenic drive to Berchtesgaden to visit Hitler's famous Eagle's Nest. The road to the top of the mountain was a birthday present for Hitler's 50<sup>th</sup> birthday. The views from the top are among the most stunning in the world, overlooking the German and Austrian Alps. B

**July 5:** *Salzburg – Vienna.* Our lovely morning drive takes us to the imperial city of Vienna, once the most dominant city in Europe and home to the once powerful Hapsburg Empire. We have included a visit to the sprawling and imposing Schonbrunn Palace where Mozart played for the royal courts at age six. We'll then enjoy other highlights of the city including Prater Park (with its famous giant ferris wheel), the Danube, the State Opera House, Hofburg Palace, beautiful St. Steven's Cathedral and more. B

**July 6:** *Vienna.* Today is a day to relax in beautiful Vienna. We suggest an excursion to beautiful Vienna Woods which is a lovely wooded area just outside of the city. Vienna is

blessed with stunning rural and urban settings. Add to that its fascinating history and you have one of Europe's most interesting destinations. This evening we will be treated to one of the great Austrian traditions: A concert (about 90 minutes in length) showcasing some of the best of Strauss and Mozart. It is an experience you won't soon forget. B

**July 7:** *Vienna – Danube Cruise – Oberammergau.* This morning we'll drive a short distance to board our river cruiser for a lovely trip down the Blue Danube. This is the most scenic section of the river taking us past Melk Abbey, the ruins of Duerenstein Castle (where Richard the Lionhearted was held captive during the Crusades) and lovely rural scenes as the rolling hills give way to the Austrian Alps. After our cruise, a coach will take us into the heart of the German Alps to the picturesque village of Oberammergau. B, D

**July 8:** *Oberammergau.* We'll have the morning to enjoy this charming town which is bustling for this once in a decade event. After lunch, we'll find our reserved seats to enjoy the Great Passion Play. The town of Oberammergau vowed that if God would spare them from the effects of the bubonic plague, they would perform a play every ten years depicting the life and death of Jesus. The death rate subsequently decreased dramatically and they kept their promise performing their first play. The play, now performed repeatedly over the course of five months, during the last year of each decade, involves over 2,000 performers, musicians, and stage technicians, all of whom are residents of the village. The play comprises spoken dramatic text, musical and choral accompaniment and more in their excellent outdoor theater (with covered seats). The play begins in the afternoon, breaks for dinner, and finishes in the evening. B, D

**July 9:** *Oberammergau – Munich.* We'll have some time for shopping in Oberammergau before leaving town. We then make our journey back to Munich, arriving in the afternoon. We'll check in and relax (and repack) as we prepare for our journey home. A delicious farewell dinner is included this evening. B, D

**July 10:** Today we return to the Munich airport for our flight back to the states. You will have completed a trip that you will never forget. B

### **Registration Information:**

To make a reservation, simply **fill out the attached reservation form and send it to us with a deposit of \$1250 per person.** This will cover your initial deposit and payment in full for the Oberammergau portion of your tour (which is due 300 days in advance of the performance, which has passed). When we receive your deposit, we will mail you a receipt confirming that you are registered for the tour. A letter with instructions, hotel itinerary flight information will be sent in January, 2010. You can use our airfare or obtain your own. Additional information with luggage tags will be sent to you by **March 1, 2010.** Your final payment for the rest of the tour will be due to Webb Tours on **March 15th, 2010.** We require final payments in the form of a check. If that is not possible, arrangements can be made to use a credit card. Webb Tours accepts Visa, Mastercard and Discover, but for international tours a surcharge of 2% will be added to the balance.

### **Cancellation Penalties**

We understand that you may need to cancel your trip for whatever reason. The Oberammergau portion of your tour is non refundable once deposited. It will be returned to you if your space is sold to someone else. They simply will not give refunds due to the popularity of the Passion Play. Cancellation penalties as departure approaches are as follows:

**+300 days prior to the commencement of services your full deposit (Travel Protection Premiums will be retained.)**

**300-210 days prior to commencement of services: \$1250 per person plus Travel Protection premiums**

**209-180 days prior to commencement of services: 60% of total price plus Travel Protection premiums**

**179-120 days prior to commencement of services: 80% of total price plus Travel Protection premiums**

**119-0 days prior to commencement of services: 100% of total price plus Travel Protection premiums**

For airlines, specifically, tickets are generally non refundable when purchased. However, most airlines will allow the value of the canceled tickets to be reused for future travel, though a penalty may be assessed to reuse the tickets. If you have to cancel, Webb Tours will work with other providers to obtain as much refund as possible for our travelers. Our travelers know us to be very fair in this regard.

### **Cancellation Insurance:**

To avoid cancellation penalties, cancellation insurance may be purchased. This insurance will reimburse you for the non-refundable cancellation penalties imposed if you must cancel your trip for a covered reason such as illness, injury or death to you, a traveling companion or an immediate family member. Other reasons for cancellation include Common Carrier-caused delays due to inclement weather, jury duty, or a documented traffic accident en route to departure.

**The per person price for insurance for this tour is \$169**

If you are interested in the insurance, it must be purchased at the time you make your deposit. Webb Tours is not the insurer and acts as agent for the insurance company. To activate your insurance, we need your premium and your birth date. In addition to refunding the cost of your tour (excluding airfare), **Travel insurance also includes \$2,500 for baggage loss, \$500 for baggage delay, up to \$50,000 for medical expenses and up to \$50,000 for medical evacuation.**

**Currency Fluctuation:** Webb Tours reserves the right to adjust the rates if necessary in order to reflect currency fluctuations larger than 10% from those used in our tour price. This is not likely to happen, but we must protect against it. A shift of that magnitude would quickly erase our tour profits. Of course, if the fluctuation moves in the opposite direction, we will reduce your tour price
